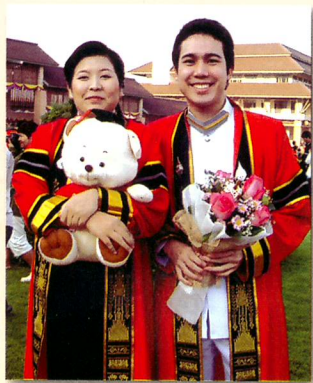

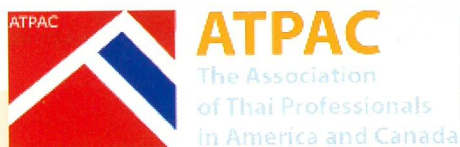

# International Visitors (December 2008 – February 2009)

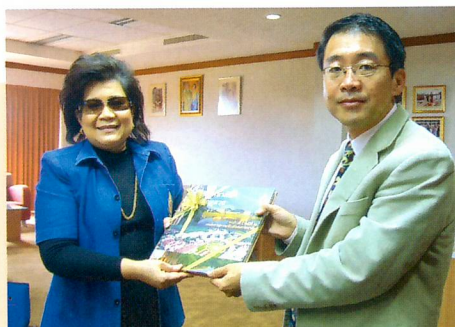

Today we have 86 full-time instructors, 49 of whom are Thais and 37 are foreigners, teaching English, Chinese, Japanese, French and general education courses.

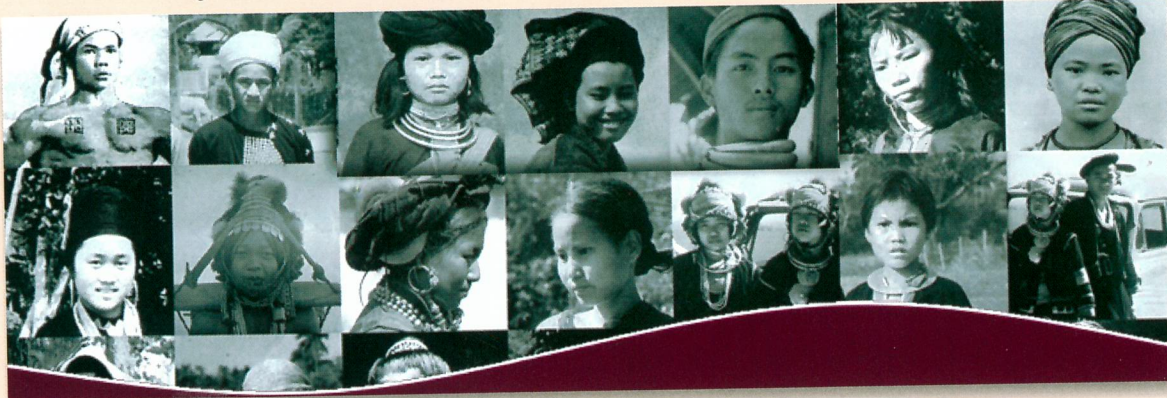

#### RATIONAL

Along the Mekong Sub-region covering China, Myanmar, Laos and Thailand an ultimate social and cultural relationship has been last long existed for generations through its multi-socio culture which reflects both assimilation and differences aspects in arts, culture, traditions, politics and indigenous wisdom. Hence, the sub-region is a world richest culture. The upper sub-region culture has been mainly evolved from settlement in mountain and highland mountain areas that had facilitated the settlements of city-state. Independent city-states had obstructed the unification of city-states. However, a few of city-states had evolved themselves to empirical states, for instance, Shan State, Chiangtung, Chiangroong and others were unsuccessfully reach their empirical status. (Chaing Rai, Ing River Bsain (Payao) and Khuen River Basin (Chiangtung). The study will include culture reception and its extension in city states and empirical states.

The indigenous wisdom in the Mekong Sub-region has been developed through both language and culture. Though the development was highly influenced by historical factors, politics and government systems, the identity, self-integrity and ethnicity in the sub-region have been stabled continuously. Strong traditional beliefs and Buddhism have widely actuated the living beauty in the sub-region by which led to prestigious Mekong Sub-region civilization.

Mae Fah Luang University, strategically situate at a prime location, highly values human resources development along with arts and culture promotion in the region. The university aims to provide a regional hub for study, research and development of arts and culture in the Mekong Sub-region in order to extend the knowledge-based society on culture, ethnic, living, fine arts, interior design and architecture through the standardized Mekong Sub-region Civilization Museum. In addition, the museum will mark the auspicious occasion on the 50th anniversary of HRH Princess Maha Chakri Sirindhorn.

#### Objectives

1. To establish a research center of arts and culture in the Mekong Subregion through a standardized museum
2. To provide a knowledge-based center for research community services and information dissemination on arts and culture in the Mekong Subregion
3. To commemorate the auspicious occasion of the 50th anniversary of HRH Princess Maha Chakri Sirindhorn

#### Mission

1. To collect and develop knowledge-based arts and culture in the Mekong Subregion
2. To collect cultural objects, photographs, books etc for displaying in the museum which will be rotated every 3 years (alter its inauguration in 2005) in order to accommodate lively and contemporary aspects.

4. To launch activities in disseminating academic study, materials, books, electronic media, seminar and rotated exhibition
5. To develop network on financial support and academic community through the involvement of individual, community, country, subregion and global concern.
