1. Programme Title

The 2nd Myanmar-Thailand Higher Education Institutions Leadership and Networking Programme

2. Background and Rationale

In response to the needs for human capacity development and to foster academic partnership between Myanmar and Thai higher education institutions, the “Myanmar-Thailand Higher Education Institutions Leadership and Networking Programme” was organized. The programme was divided into two parts; first part was held from 26 - 30 June 2017 at Mae Fah Luang University and the Chiang Mai province; and another part was held at the University of Mandalay and Tuanggyi University from 16 - 20 October 2017. There were 15 executives from both Thailand's and Myanmar's higher education institutions participating in this leadership workshop which included 7 executives from Myanmar universities, 7 executives from Thai universities, and one observer from the Department of Higher Education, Myanmar.

After completing the programme, participants were equipped with knowledge of Myanmar and Thai higher education management systems. The programme also advanced the participants' understanding of working in a cross-cultural environment and provided them an abundance of opportunities to build up the network of Myanmar-Thailand Higher Education Institutions for future collaborative projects.

The successful outcome is evidenced by the recognition of programme's importance from Myanmar government. With recognising the importance of this programme, Myanmar government provided financial support for organising the programme during 15 - 20 October 2017 in Myanmar. It's also encouraged all participating universities to sign the Memorandum of Understanding for the Myanmar-Thailand Higher Education Institution Network.

Furthermore, Myanmar government has set the policy for all universities to establish the International Office at their universities. The International Offices will greatly contribute to Thailand's strategy to build academic cooperation in the future.

For these reasons, the 2nd Myanmar-Thailand Higher Education Institutions Leadership and Networking Programme is held to serve as a venue for higher education administrators to exchange knowledge and good practices in order to develop the administration of higher education especially in areas of **international affairs** and **research**. In addition, this programme will be a channel for communication that supports and fosters the sustainable academic cooperation between Thailand and Myanmar.

2. To enable the sustainable academic collaboration among Myanmar and Thai universities.
3. To strengthen Thai and Myanmar universities through academic and research collaboration.

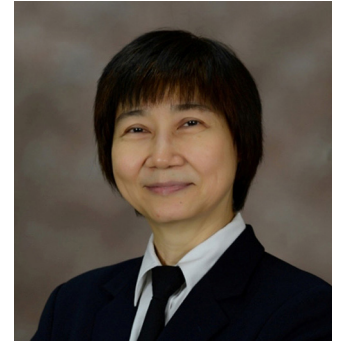
