

Shanxi Province Symphony Orchestra Thailand Concert Tour



On the occasion of the 41th Anniversary of Thailand and China Diplomatic Relations, MFU and China Cultural Centre had collaboratively organised the 'Shanxi Province Symphony Orchestra Thailand Concert Tour' on 10 May 2016 at C4 Princess Mother Auditorium, MFU.

Shanxi Province Symphomy Orchestra was founded in 1952, is the only state-owned professional symphony orchestra in the region with its orchestra members and choral. In 2013, the orchestra commenced its music season, and invited the German conductor Elahiu von Erlenbach as its Music Director, and honored to be commissioned a symphonic suite A Preliminary Sketch of Yellow River by renowned composer Wang Xilin. In the past 66 years, the orchestra has collaborated with conductors and musicians both from home and abroad, and presented numerous premiers and concerts. The orchestra has been presenting near 200 repertoires, the Circle of Beethoven, Schubert, Bizet, Tchaikovsky had attracted the audience from all walk of life from the Province.

Elahiu von Erlenbach, the music director, was born

in Germany and got his music education in Hochschule für Musik und Darstellende Kunst Frankfurt and Hochschule fuer Musik 'HannsEisler' Berlin, studied under famous conductor Sergiu Celibidache. Mr. Erlenbach participated in the creation of the 'German Frankfurt Music Performing Arts Association' and served as its Artistic Director. Mr. Erlenbach is the only Foreign Expert as the conductor approved by the Ministry of Culture.

Dr. Romyen Kosaikanont, MFU Vice President, presented the report prior to the formal opening of the event. Mr. Zhu Jian-An, Concert Master, and Mr. Chao Xiaoliang, Consulate General of the People's Republic of China in Chiang Mai, opened the ceremony, remarking on the performances, and history of Shanxi Province that will help to enhance our understanding of Chinese's culture especially Shanxi Province. The highlights of the performances were Liu Feng (Celebrating), Yan Jinxuan (The White Haired Girl – Ballad), Bao Yuankai (Selections from Yan Huang Suite), Duet by Shun Jun & Guo Lanwen. The event went successfully with over 1,400 participants.



The Foreign Affairs Executive Programme, Batch 8/2016

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Thailand designed the Foreign Affairs Executive Programme on 19 May to 11 August 2016 (12 weeks full time course) from 09.00 to 15.30 hrs., for diplomatic executives to enable them to meet the high expectations arising from their new roles. As in the context of a globalised world with its concomitant process of international integration and the interchange of worldviews, trade, capital and investment, migration and movement of people, and the dissemination of knowledge via digital technology and social media, countries must face and adapt to the many new opportunities and challenges of the modern time. Diplomatic executives, as representatives of their countries, whose responsibilities encompass not only traditional foreign service but also other dimensions of bilateral and multilateral cooperation, are expected to grasp the breadth and depth of contemporary issues and be able to synergize and implement the best policies and practices. They need to be well-equipped with the leadership and management skills for the effective administration of overseas missions as well as to develop specialized competencies as the scope of their work expands in the future. Dr. Romyen Kosaikanont, MFU Vice President is one of the participants in this programme.

This programme aim at sharing the knowledge of trends and developments in the current world affairs and emerging issues, as well as related opportunities and challenges. The knowledge of Thailand; Thai foreign policy, economic outlook, as well as historical and cultural aspects of Thailand. The knowledge of leadership and management skills; organisational management and administration, decision-making and conflict management. The knowledge of diplomacy and diplomatic skills; diplomatic protocol and public diplomacy. Experiential learning, group discussions, study trips (both domestic and overseas study trips), active learning, best practices learning, and individual study are used as the methodology.

On 28 June 2016, Assoc. Prof. Dr. Vanchai Sirichana, MFU President was invited by Devawongse Varopakarn Institute of Foreign Affairs (DVIFA), Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Thailand to be a guest speaker. Visiting Scholars Programme


