

3. Diploma of Science

(Health Care Service)

Entry requirement: secondary school.
This is a two years diploma course in health care service.

4. Certificate in Thai massage

This is a course in Thai massage of 800 hours over a period of four months. The program suits those who seek an expertise in the practice of Thai massage and manipulation techniques to a level of an independent practitioner's, either for the improvement of their own family's health, or as a business venture. The course is approved by the Ministry of Public Health from whom a certificate is issued at the completion of the course

Highlights of programs :

1. Bachelor of Applied Thai Traditional Medicine (Applied Thai Traditional Medicine)

Entry requirement: secondary school, science stream.

1st year: foundation year ; medical terminology; basic medical science; pharmacognosy.

2nd year; Anatomy and physiology; nutrition; modern and traditional pharmacology, Thai Traditional Medicine and massage

3rd year: Radiology; microbiology; paediatric and midwifery; practical Thai Traditional Medicine in clinics.

4th year: Further practical clinical studies; law and ethics; equilibropathy; elective studies from a wide range of subjects.

Graduates are eligible to sit a state examination to become a full practitioner in Applied Thai Traditional Medicine.



2. Bachelor of Science

(Health Care Service)

Entry requirement: secondary school.

1st year: Foundation year; medical terminology, basic science, pharmacognosy.

2nd year; Human function and dysfunction, nutrition, first aid and emergencies, child development, health promotion

3rd year; Management in health care, prosthesis and orthotic, care of the child and the elderly.

4th year; Practical experience in care of the disabled and the chronically sick. There is an opportunity to visit care institutes abroad.

Employment opportunities are in both the state and private sectors ; for example : care provision for individuals in their own home, nursing home or hospital; in management of care homes and in tourism.
